Game Plan - UHACK 2024

Networking and Team Formation

Upon your arrival at UQO, you will need to confirm your presence at the reception table located at the entrance of the competition hall (Grand Hall of the Alexandre-Taché Campus, door #1). You will then receive your gift bag and badge.

The period from 5:00 PM to 5:30 PM is designated for networking. You will have the opportunity to discuss with your mentors and build connections with other participants. This is an opportunity for students who do not have a team to form one or join an existing group. Each team can accommodate 2 to 5 members.

Presentation of Challenges

At 5:30 PM, the hosts will explain the hackathon's proceedings and competition rules. Subsequently, around 6:00 PM, our partner (City of Gatineau) will present the 2024 Challenge. A question period will follow this presentation.

You will then need to officially register your team with the organizing committee. Once done, you can start working on your project.

Tech Zone

In addition to working on the main project, you will have the opportunity to participate in workshops at the *Tech Zone*. These workshops, organized by the Outaouais Digital Summit (SON) team, cover a variety of topics related to digital solution design, including hacking, drone programming, and IoT.

Visiting the *Tech Zone* will allow you to acquire new personal skills or expertise not held by any member of your team, maximizing your chances of designing the best possible digital solution!

Project Work Period

Work on the project can begin as soon as the team is officially registered on Friday, April 26, and can continue until 12:00 PM on Sunday, April 28.

Presentations, Deliberation, and Announcement of Winners

Each team must nominate a spokesperson who will be responsible for presenting the project on stage, in front of the audience. Each presentation is a maximum of 5 minutes.

Following the presentations, the judges will leave the room for closed deliberations (from 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM). During this time, a surprise challenge is planned for the participants.

At 4:00 PM, the winning teams will be announced, and prizes will be awarded. This will be followed by acknowledgments and closing remarks.
